Grammar of Toddlers

Stage 1 Holophrastic Speech

- *Holophrase*—a one-word utterance that may vary in meaning depending on the toddler's intentions. For example, "Daddy," may mean "Where is Daddy?" or "There's Daddy."
- Common Single Words

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Important people—mama, daddy
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Foods—milk, juice

Actions—bye-bye, hug, kiss

Outside objects—house, tree, snow

Body parts—nose, ear

Clothing—shoes, hat

Animals—specific pets, farm or zoo animals

Household items—lights, fans, clocks

Vehicles—car, plane

Toys-books, dolls, trucks

Places—park, pool

Adult items—keys, watch, ring

Stage 2 Telegraphic Speech

- *Telegraphic speech*—"sentence" consisting of only content words, not *function words* (articles, prepositions, conjunctions, auxiliary verbs).
- Common Word Combinations and Meanings

Identification—See kitty

Location—Book table

Nonexistence—Milk all gone

Negation—No bath

Possession—My truck

Attribution—Big dog

Recurrence—Tickle again

Question—What that?
